

Terms of Reference and Criteria for an Indigenous Peoples Co-Moderator

Paragraph 10. "Decides that the first activity of the platform will be a multistakeholder workshop on implementing the functions referred to in paragraph 6 above, which would be co-moderated by the Chair of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice and a representative of local communities and indigenous peoples organizations, and that these co-moderators would make an equal contribution to the design of the workshop"

The Indigenous Peoples' Co-Moderator will represent the positions /point of view of International Indigenous Peoples Forum on Climate Change (IIPFCC) when facilitating the modalities of the Indigenous Platform.

TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CO-MODERATOR:

- 1. Seek direction and guidance from the IIPFCC.
- 2. Work closely with the SBSTA Co-Chair to design the activities of the Multi-Stakeholder Workshop.
- 3. Conversant on global indigenous peoples issues and systems relating to traditional knowledge and practices and their dynamics across all regions.
- 3. Support and promote the objectives of the GSC/IIPFCC; and the work programme.
- 4. Support the objectives of the IIPFCC towards the establishment of the Indigenous Peoples Platform.
- 5. Be available for discussions to Indigenous Peoples, States, NGOs, UN Agencies and Bodies, and other interested parties for dialogue on the Indigenous Peoples Platform.
- 6. Support and participate when possible, in consultations on the Indigenous Peoples Platform
- 7. Carry out any other activities as decided by the GSC/IIPFCC to achieve a successful Indigenous Peoples Platform.
- 8. Co-moderator will provide regular updates on the relevant activities and progress to the GSC and to the IIPFCC via the list serve.
- 9. Term of the role will be until the completion of COP 24
- 10. The GSC/IIPFCC will review and determine the need for the role post-COP 24.

COMPETENCIES AND SELECTION CRITERIA

The Co-Moderator should possess the following skills:

- 1. Demonstrate high advocacy and diplomatic skills under the UNFCCC
- 2. Previous experience in UNFCCC processes
- 3. Conversant on global indigenous peoples issues and their dynamics across all regions
- 4. Must have participated in any UN processes representing indigenous peoples and he/she is able to demonstrate results due to their participation
- 5. Have fluency in English, it would be preferable for the candidate to speak French and Spanish but this would be considered added value
- 6. Is able to demonstrate a background in the United Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and its implementation at the local, regional and/or international level

Advisory Notes

- The successful candidate will be selected by the Global Steering Committee, by consensus
- Candidates submitted from the Regions that do not possess all of the skills will be considered, however priority consideration will be given to those candidates that meet all the criteria.
- There can only be one nominated candidate for the Co-Moderator Role per Region
- This role is not funded. The nominated candidate must be able to fund their own participation. The GSC/IIPFCC will seek avenues for funding from our partners however funding is not guaranteed.

Timeframe TOR document:

- This document is emailed out to the Caucus on the 11th of December
- Any comments on this document should be given to the regional GSC, by 20th of December.
- The 21th of December the comments provided by GSC (to Jannie.staffansson@biegke.com) will have been incorporated and the final document circulated.

Timeframe Co-moderator:

- Between the **21th of December 15th of January** will the GSC have received the nomination of the Co-moderator.
- No later than the 1th of February 2018 will the Co-moderator be announced by the IIPFCC Co-Chair.
